One of the key findings is that the most segregated Latino neighborhood in the San Francisco Bay area is in San Rafael's Canal region and the most segregated white neighborhoods are in small, sparsely populated areas like Ross, Belvedere, Mill Valley and Los Gatos. San Rafael is also mentioned in a list of the "most segregated (intramunicipal) cities.
