RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Appoint three Countywide Priority Setting Committee members representing protected classes for: Fairfax, Ross, San Anselmo, and adjacent unincorporated communities; Belvedere, Mill Valley, Sausalito, Tiburon and adjacent unincorporated communities, including Marin City and Tam Valley; and a Countywide, at large member.
- 2. Provide an update on the 2020-24 Consolidated Plan and the community engagement process currently underway.

DISCUSSION:

Appoint New PSC Members

Beginning on August 23, 2019 community residents were invited to apply to be members of the Countywide Priority Setting Committee to oversee the distribution of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME) funds in Marin County.

This year there are three (3) openings on the Countywide Priority Setting Committee for community members representing the interests of racial and ethnic minorities and/or people with disabilities. The openings are for community members from the following regions:

- Fairfax, Ross, San Anselmo, and adjacent unincorporated communities
- Belvedere, Mill Valley, Sausalito, Tiburon and adjacent unincorporated communities, including Marin City and Tam Valley
- Countywide, at large member

Upon selection, community members will sit for a two-year term from October 2019 through September 2021.

The Countywide Priority Setting Committee currently includes a member of the Board of Supervisors, city/town council members, as well as seven (7) community members representing six (6) regions spanning Marin and an at-large member representing the County. The regions include the following:

- Countywide (All Marin County)
- Belvedere, Mill Valley, Sausalito, Tiburon, and adjacent unincorporated communities, including Marin City and Tam Valley
- Corte Madera, Larkspur, and adjacent unincorporated communities, including Greenbrae and Kentfield
- Fairfax, Ross, San Anselmo, and adjacent unincorporated communities
- Novato and adjacent unincorporated communities
- San Rafael including the Canal neighborhood, and adjacent unincorporated communities
- West Marin consisting entirely of unincorporated communities

The Countywide Priority Setting Committee was expanded in 2012 to include member of the community with the goal of bringing greater diversity to the group that:

- (1) advises the Board of Supervisors on the CDBG and HOME funding allocation process and
- (2) provides input on the County's implementation of the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice.

Therefore, the recruitment of community members is specifically for individuals who are members of a racial and ethnic minority and/or people with disabilities, or who represent these interests.

Applications were accepted until 4pm on September 26th, 2019. However, because no applications were received during this time period from the Fairfax, Ross, San Anselmo, & adjacent unincorporated communities, applications for this seat were extended until October 11th, 2019 at 4pm. To date, the following applications were received for the three openings on the Committee:

Staff recommends that you review the applications, conduct interviews, and select three Committee members to represent members of the protected classes under fair housing law.

Update on the Consolidated Plan

Every five years, the County of Marin submits a Five-Year Federal Funding Plan, also known as a Consolidated Plan (Con Plan), to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Con Plan provides a framework for identifying priorities and programs to address affordable housing, community development needs, and public services for extremely low- up to moderate-income families, persons with disabilities, seniors, and youth. Funding is provided through block grant programs including the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME).

This year, the Con Plan process timeline overlapped with two (2) other planning processes being conducted by County divisions. This provided a unique opportunity to collaborate on community engagement in order to reach a broader audience and address community concerns and issues in a holistic manner. Together the Community Development Agency (CDA) and the Marin Health and Human Services Department (HHS) collaborated to inform the following plans:

- Housing and Federal Grants Division's 5-Year Consolidated Plan
- Mental Health Services Act 3-Year Plan
- Substance Use Services 5-Year Plan

The collective community outreach process to engage citizens has included community meetings; a community survey in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese available in both an online and hardcopy format; a service provider survey; and presentations at community and nonprofit partners events.

Since commencing in June, this coalition has hosted six (6) community meetings across the county, including one conducted entirely in Spanish; collected almost 200 community surveys and 23 service provider surveys; and staff have participated in nearly 20 community and nonprofit partner events to facilitate focus groups and distribute surveys.

Over the course of the next two months, staff will conduct interviews with other County departments and neighboring jurisdictions. In addition, staff will analyze data gathered through the community meeting, surveys, and focus groups.

Recommendations for the 2020-24 Con Plan will be informed by the outcomes of the community engagement process detailed above, updated county demographics and trends, the Voluntary Compliance Agreement established between the County and HUD in May of 2019, and the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing, which is currently being completed.

The draft Con Plan is expected to be available for review by the Countywide Priority Setting Committee in February of 2020. The 2020-24 Con Plan will go into effect on July 1, 2020.

PG. 4 OF 4 Update on the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice

The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI), one of the documents informing the 2020-24 Con Plan, is designed to identify barriers to fair housing choice and provide recommendations to overcome those barriers. The AI achieves this by:

- Assessing conditions, both public and private, affecting fair housing choice for all protected classes
- Reviewing the jurisdictions laws, regulation, and administrative policies, procedures and practices
- Assessing of how those laws, etc. affect the location, availability and accessibility of housing
- Assessing the availability of affordable, accessible housing

The County's last completed AI was approved by the Board of Supervisors on October 28, 2011.

Beginning in 2016 County staff began working on an Assessment of Fair Housing (AFH), which was intended to replace the AI. However, since commencing this work, HUD suspended the AFH process until no sooner than October 31, 2020. In the interim, local governments and other federal grant participants are required to prepare and submit an AI by January of 2020.

Because of this change and at the direction of HUD, staff are utilizing research and community engagement data compiled for the AFH and have spent the past several months identifying supplemental information to write the AI and ensure it meets federal rules.

The full report identifying barriers to fair housing choice and providing recommendations to overcome those barriers will be provided to the Countywide Priority Setting Committee in December, prior to going to the Board of Supervisors for approval.

Under fair housing laws, it is illegal to discriminate in the sale, rental, and financing in housing-related transactions based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, and familial status (including households with children under the age of 18, pregnant women, and people securing custody of children under the age of 18). What services, if any, do you see are needed in Marin County for members of the protected classes to access information, opportunity, and options to live where they choose without discrimination?

Free and subsidized child-care is critical as is housing. Marin County should be increasing the number of housing units, in addition to supporting rent control programs and programs to help low-income individuals and families purchase their own homes. Public transportation is also very important, commuting costs are burdensome and Marin County needs to have expansive public transportation options within the county and to other nearby parts of the bay area where many Marin County residents may work (i.e. Novato, San Francisco and the east bay).

Access to information will also be key as we need to make sure everyone we are trying to help with these programs would know about them and know how best to take advantage of these support systems. This means making free or low cost information providers available (we can't rely solely on the internet, phone services and in person services will be needed), and making sure such services are available at a variety of times of day so people working outside standard business hours or working long hours or multiple jobs can access key information as well.

One of the greatest impediments for members of the protected classes to live where they choose is housing affordability. Marin, along with San Francisco and San Mateo Counties, has the highest housing costs in the country along with some of the highest incomes. Affordable Housing based on the AMI is often out of reach for lower income workers and seniors or those living with disabilities. Layering Project Based Vouchers with LIHTC developments and others, or with existing market rate housing is one way that would provide an equal opportunity for people of all income levels in Marin to have opportunity and options to live where they choose.

Fair Housing of Northern California provides services to those who have experienced housing discrimination as well as education of the Fair Housing Laws. Services that expand the public's awareness of Fair Housing of Northern California and the services they provide would be of benefit.


