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I. Executive Summary

Inmar Rx Solutions, Inc (“Inmar”) was approved to operate a Drug Stewardship Program (“Program”) on December 21st, 2021 pursuant to the Marin County Safe Drug Disposal Ordinance, Marin County Code Chapter 7.90.010 – 7.90.160 (“Ordinance”). This Annual Report is for the Reporting Period between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022. All capitalized terminologies not defined in this summary are the same as those used in Inmar’s approved Drug Stewardship Plan (“Plan”) dated October 18, 2021, as revised November 16, 2021.

Inmar notified Marin County during the Reporting Period of the closure of 1 Drop-off Site due to the unexpected closure of Lucky Pharmacies in the state of California. Inmar’s Plan was approved with 3 Drop-off Sites but operated with 2 Drop-off Sites for the remainder of the Reporting Period.

Throughout the Reporting Period, Inmar collected Unwanted Covered Drugs by means of Drop-off Sites (Kiosks) and Mail-back Services including Mail-Back Distribution Sites, as well as by request via the Program’s website or toll-free phone number.

Inmar’s primary focus for the first year of operation as stated in the goals section of the Plan was to increase Drop-off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Sites to provide convenient and equitable access as dictated by Ordinance Sec. 7.90.080(B)(1).

Inmar endeavored to supplement Drop-off Sites by securing additional Mail-Back Distribution Sites. During this Reporting Period, Inmar operated 2 Kiosks (after the Lucky Kiosk closure) and 53 Mail-Back Distribution Sites for a total of 55 locations. Inmar collected Inner Liners from three Kiosks for a total of 16 Inner Liners collected in 2022. Sixteen collected Inner Liners equated to a total of 463.10 pounds of Unwanted Covered Drugs collected. There were 141 returned Mailers for a total of 49.36 pounds. Total weight collected in 2022 was 512.46 pounds of Unwanted Covered Drugs. This Annual Report mirrors the requirements outlined in Section 7.90.110 of the Ordinance.

A. Collection Points

Table 2 in Appendix B lists each of Inmar’s Drop-off Sites in Marin County. Table 1 in Appendix B lists the weight for each Drop-off Site and the corresponding number of liners collected. The number of liners in Column titled “Liners Collected” is indicative of the number of times the product was picked up from each location. Inmar has included a key for the Department to refer to for the Unique Identifier.

Inmar did not host any collection events during the Reporting Period.

B. Standard Mail-Back Envelope Distribution Sites

Table 3 in Appendix B lists each participating Mail-Back Distribution Site. Each of these sites were provided with Standard Mail-Back Envelopes. During the Reporting Period, Inmar distributed 76 Standard Mail-Back Envelopes, 7 Inhaler Mail-Back Envelopes and 10 Auto-Injector Mail-Back Envelopes from requests received via the Program website and distributed 1,620 Standard Mail-Back Envelopes to Mail-Back Distribution Sites during the reporting period. Of the 1,620 Standard Mail-Back Envelopes distributed, 270 Mailers were provided to OD Free Marin for their outreach events. Inmar collected a total of 49.36 pounds of weight from 141 Standard Mail-Back Envelopes during the Reporting Period.

Inmar is not able to verify if a recipient is disabled an/or home-bound, therefore our numbers include a total for each Mailer distributed. Another item we plan on addressing in the next year includes building a partnership with an organization(s) to assist with reaching the homeless population.

During the process of gathering data for the Annual Report, Inmar discovered an operational process gap in conjunction with its Service Provider which resulted in a plan deviation. Returned Liners were destroyed at a waste-to-energy facility not included in the approved Plan. Due to the operational process gap identified, Inmar’s Reverse Distributor Service Provider was not able to identify that these Liners needed to be destroyed as medical or hazardous waste in accordance with Ordinance Sec 7.90.100. The Service Provider, therefore, had the Unwanted Covered Drugs witness transported to a waste-to-energy facility in good faith with the intent to provide timely

destruction in accordance with all applicable DEA regulations.

Upon discovering the operational gap that led to the Plan deviation, Inmar put new processes in place to ensure that existing Liners in the Marin County Program going forward will be destroyed as medical or hazardous waste. Marin County can be confident that Inmar's processes and Service Provider are currently operating in compliance with Ordinance Sec 7.90.100.

VI. Safety or Security Concerns

Policies and Procedures for collecting, transporting and disposing of Unwanted Covered Drugs, as established in the Plan, were followed in the Reporting Period. There are no Safety or Security Concerns for the Reporting Period.

VII. Educational Efforts and Public Outreach

Ordinance Sec. 7.90.110.9: A description of the public education, outreach and evaluation activities implemented during the reporting period;

A. Educational Materials

In accordance with Ordinance Section 7.9.100 Inmar provided easily-consumable educational materials for distribution to County Residents including Pharmacies, health care facilities, veterinary facilities, and other interested parties for dissemination to County Residents at no charge. Education materials included standardized disposal instructions for Collectors of Unwanted Covered Drugs and Mail-Back Services, an educational brochure that includes tips for safe storage, where and how to dispose of Unwanted Covered Drugs. Additionally, Inmar created a program website and toll-free phone number for residents to visit and call to order Mail-Back materials as well as inquire about general Program operations. All materials are easily understandable with varying levels of English proficiencies and leverage explanatory graphics to aid in understanding. Materials are available in English and Spanish.

B. Outreach Activities

Inmar administered the following outreach activities during the Reporting Period:

1. Digital Media - Programmatic

Programmatic Media provides targeted display ads on browser sites on internet capable devices (smart phones, computers, tablets, etc.). Inmar ran ads across a prequalified list of over 200,000 domains including a variety of retail websites, Google, and Facebook. The programmatic targeted ads ran for six weeks leading up to the DEA's National Prescription Take Back Days from October 1, 2022 to November 15, 2022. Impression metrics are reported directly from the individual websites that the ads are placed on and are reported on a per campaign basis. See Appendix F - Table 1 for programmatic results. Table 1 lists all Ad units served to viewers with the corresponding metrics by size of the image. There are different ad sizes listed due to websites having different ad space available across our 200,000 pre-qualified domain list. Examples of the Programmatic ads are in Appendix F - Figure 2. The line items in Appendix F - Table 1 represent the different sizes of

images available and used throughout the programmatic campaign. In order to have the ability to have advertisements on the 200,000 website domains, multiple image sizes are required to fit unique website size constraints.

2. Digital Media - Influencer Marketing and Social Media

Influencer marketing is a content creation tactic used to drive awareness and education to a targeted audience through blogs and social media outlets. Influencers create authentic content around their everyday lives and interests while weaving the story of prescription drug take-back into their content. Influencer content is converted into paid ad units across social platforms and then targeted to community members across Marin County.

Paid advertisements for influencer content were run on a variety of platforms including Google, Instagram and Facebook and drove towards a specified impression goal. Inmar ran several social media influencer campaigns concurrently with other traditional and digital media campaigns. Inmar posted two social media posts per month per platform (Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook). Influencer campaigns were deployed every quarter that Inmar was approved to operate for a total of four influencer campaigns in 2022.

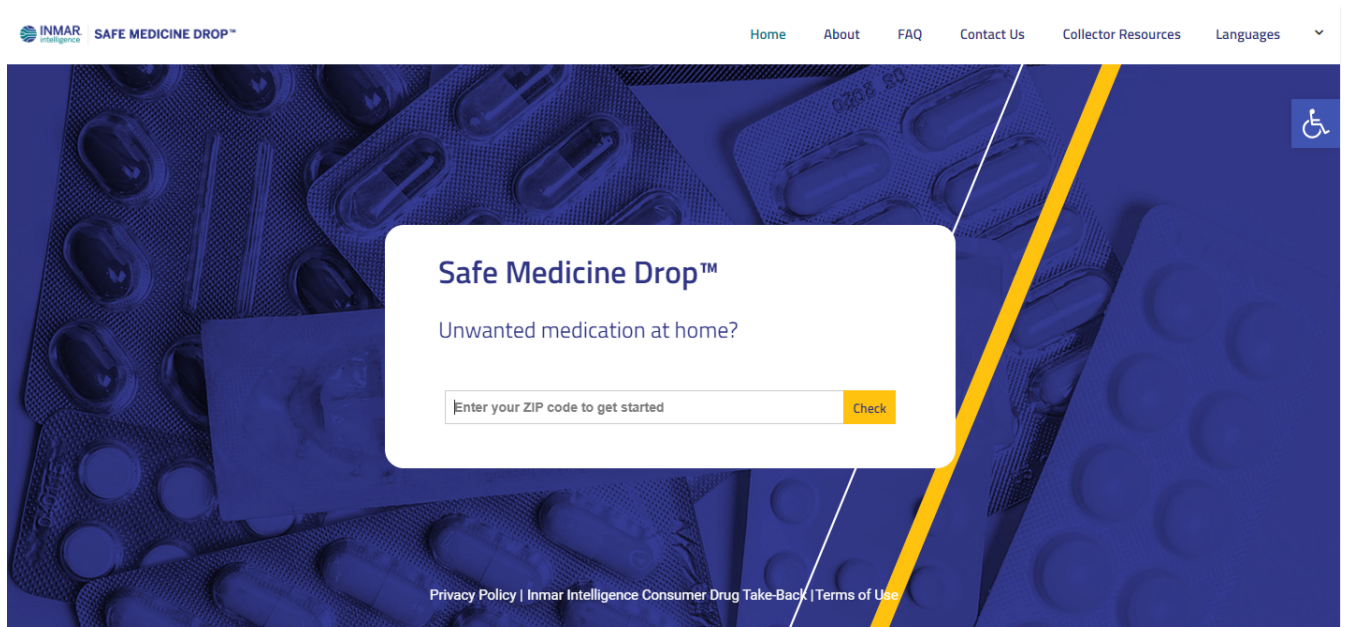


Figure 1 - www.SafeMedicineDrop.com Landing Page

Influencer campaigns in Marin County were projected to have approximately 400,000 impressions. Each quarter that the campaign was run either met or exceeded the number of expected impressions. Images used in the influencer campaigns are included in Appendix F - Figure 1. The dates and results of each campaign are listed in Appendix F - Table 2.

VIII. Recycling

Ordinance Sec. 7.90.110.10: A description of how collected packaging was recycled to the extent feasible, including the recycling facility or facilities used;

DEA § 1317.75(c) prohibits handling substances after they have been deposited into a Kiosk. For this reason, Inmar is unable to separate and recycle drug packaging. Inmar will, however, execute educational programs, as outlined in Section IX, to encourage County residents to separate Unwanted Covered Drugs from their packaging and recycle the packaging prior to disposal.

Even though regulations prevent us from recycling drug packaging, Inmar has an interest in reducing waste and improving our environment. Through its Rx Returns and related business lines, Inmar has saved over 20,000 barrels of oil, recovered over 11,000 megawatts of clean energy, and powered over 900 homes in the past two years alone. We will continue to look for opportunities to expand our eco-friendly efforts in the County.

IX. Stewardship Plan Goals

Ordinance Sec. 7.90.110.11: A summary of the Stewardship Plan's goals, the degree of success in meeting those goals in the past year, and, if any goals have not been met, what effort will be made to achieve the goals in the next year; and

A. Program Collection Goals

Inmar met short-term collection goals outlined in the approved Plan by securing and placing Kiosks and Mail-Back Distribution Sites throughout the County within 90 days of Plan approval. Inmar launched a website (www.safemedicinedrop.com) and phone number (1-888-371-0717) within 60 days of Plan approval. This website and phone number was used during the entirety of the Reporting Period as a single website and phone number with other Program Operators was not created until 2023. Additionally, Inmar submitted a project plan and timeline for serving underserved communities within 90 days of Plan approval and executed the project plan accordingly.

Inmar’s long term goal was to update signage on Kiosks with a new website and toll-free phone number based on the coordination efforts with other Program Operators as dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.100(A). This goal is currently in progress as the joint website and phone number were developed in quarter two 2023. Inmar’s second long term goal was to increase Drop-off Sites and Mail-Back Distribution Sites to provide convenient and equitable access as dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.080(B)(1). Due to the unforeseen closure of Lucky Pharmacies, one of Inmar’s Kiosks was closed during the Reporting Period.

In an effort to establish and increase Drop-off Sites throughout Marin County, Inmar submitted a public records request to determine how many pharmacies and Mail-Back Distribution Sites are available in the County. The number of available pharmacies that are not already contracted by an existing Program Operator is very limited. After exhaustive research was conducted, it was determined that there were only three eligible pharmacies to place a Kiosk. Inmar solicited these pharmacies but were either met with declined participation or a lack of response. In an effort to compensate for the lack of available pharmacies to place Kiosks, Inmar solicited potential Mail-Back Distribution Sites and secured an additional six Mail-Back Distribution Sites during the Reporting Period.

B. Program Promotion Goals

Inmar met short-term and long term promotion goals by launching the program website (www.safemedicinedrop.com) and toll-free phone number (1-888-371-0717) within the first 90 days of program operation. Phase One website functionality updates included Mail-Back envelope requests, educational materials uploaded, Collector Kiosk maintenance resources and requests were uploaded, and Drop-off and Mail-Back Distribution Site lists were uploaded. Educational materials were also developed and distributed to County Residents and Collectors within the first 90 days. Additionally, Collectors were provided Kiosk training materials and marketing materials that included a sample press release, educational materials, promotional materials, and signage.

Inmar initiated social influencer and social media outreach in January, 2022. Social media posts consisted of two posts per month per platform (Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook). The first social influencer campaign

occurred from March 14, 2022 through April 14, 2022 and the second social influencer campaign was from April 21, 2022 through May 18, 2022. The third social influencer campaign was deployed from September 8, 2022 through September 20, 2022 and the fourth influencer campaign ran from October 10, 2022 through October 21, 2022. Influencer campaigns set goals of 400,000 impressions per campaign. Each quarter that the campaign was run either met or exceeded the number of expected impressions. Inmar initiated communication for coordination with other approved Plan Operators within 90 days of approval dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.100(A) with a goal of establishing the single system of promotion. However, progress was slow until County intervention in quarter one of 2023.

Inmar met long-term goals by continuously updating Kiosk and Mail-Back Distribution Site lists, continuing on the social influencer and social media outreach initiatives both monthly and quarterly. Inmar conducted a biennial survey of County Residents, pharmacists, veterinarians and health professionals as dictated by Ordinance § 7.90.100(A)(4). The biennial survey was completed in 2023.

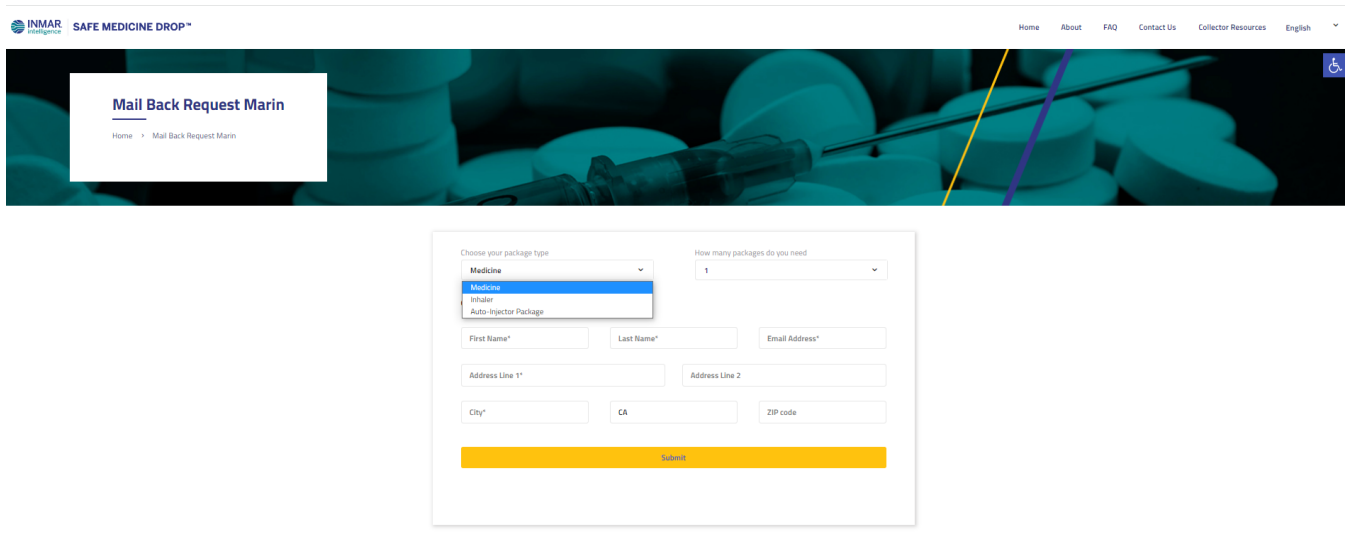


Figure 4 - www.safemedicinedrop.com Mail-Back Request - Marin County

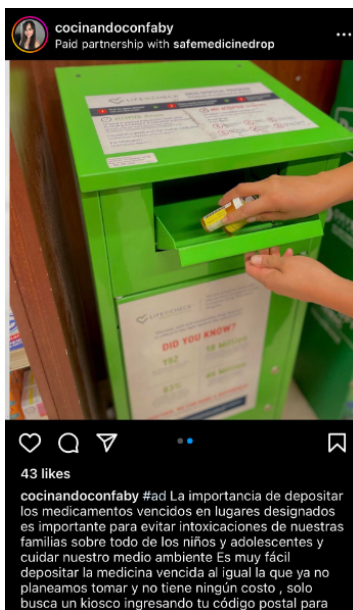
