When most people think of volunteering, they may not imagine working in an office and ensuring that fellow volunteers' hours are properly counted. Since April of 2013, **Shannon Moore** has been volunteering as part of Marin County's Meals on Wheels program, helping to make safety and eligibility assessments for homebound clients. With a degree in health education, Shannon is a natural fit with the program, which is run through Health and Human Services (HHS) Division of Aging and Adult Services. "I really like working with older clients and making sure they are getting what they need. My work is very satisfying and I enjoy working with the great staff in the Marin program," said Shannon.

"Shannon is friendly, efficient, dedicated, and a much valued asset to the program," said her supervisor, **Julie Daniel**.
