



























World Heritage Site Criteria for Cultural Sites

- 1. To represent a masterpiece of human creative genius
- 2. To exhibit an important interchange of human values, over a span of time or within a cultural area of the world, on developments in architecture or technology, monumental arts, town-planning or landscape design
- 3. To bear a unique or at least exceptional testimony to a cultural tradition or to a civilization which is living or which has disappeared
- 4. To be an outstanding example of a type of building, architectural or technological ensemble or landscape which illustrates (a) significant stage(s) in human history
- 5. To be an outstanding example of a traditional human settlement, land-use, or sea-use which is representative of a culture (or cultures), or human interaction with the environment especially when it has become vulnerable under the impact of irreversible change
- 6. To be directly or tangibly associated with events or living traditions, with ideas, or with beliefs, with artistic and literary works of outstanding universal significance. (The Committee considers that this criterion should preferably be used in conjunction with other criteria);





- Properties apply for inclusion on the US Tentative List
- Get Stake holder support
- NPS reviews application
- Based on comments application is revised
- NPS recommends properties that meet requirements
- Properties are published in the Federal Register
- Comment period
- Recommended properties reviewed by the U.S. National Commission for UNESCO
- Assistant Secretary Fish and Wildlife announces Tentative List


World Heritage List Nomination Process

- Properties begin the WHL application
- Federal Register
- Public Comment
- Federal Interagency Panel for World Heritage calls on the Assistant Secretary
- Panel's recommendation's are published in the Federal Register
- Public Comment
- NPS Office of International Affairs notifies elected officials
- Properties are notified they may submit their application (process is here)
- Based on comments, application is revised
- A workshop of international experts in the field is convened to review and comment on the application
- Based on comments application is revised
- Draft nomination goes to World Heritage Centre in Paris for technical review
- Federal Interagency Panel for WH convenes again to review and recommend
- The Panel's recommendation goes to the Assistant Secretary
- Nomination is printed and bound
- Nomination sent through various agencies and ultimately to Paris
- ICOMOS sends an official "mission" to the US to review the nominated sites
- ICOMOS issues a report and recommendation to UNESCO WHC
- WHC votes on inscription at their annual meeting










Frederick C Robie House (1908-10)












Fallingwater (1934-39)






Administration Building and Research Tower (1936-39; 1943-50)















The Price Tower (1952-56)

Recommended Next Steps

- Accept staff report and authorize President to execute Communication Plan and Memorandum of Agreement
- Authorize CAO, with County Counsel review as required, to implement steps for nomination process
- Direct staff to return to BOS with update upon completion of the application to the NPS
- Direct staff to work with Civic Center Conservancy and other organizations to garner local support for World Heritage status
- Prepare Civic Center for site tours in summer/fall 2013
