Program/Project Name: Canal Neighborhood Collaborative

Summary of how County funds would be used for project:

The investment of \$10,000 will fund the development of the Canal Neighborhood Collaborative. The funds will be used to engage in a community process, to design a structure for cross-sector collaboration, communication and accountability.

Amount Requested Dollar: The investment of \$10,000 will fund the development of the Canal Neighborhood

Total Project Cost: \$40,000.00

Description of the proposed project/program, including the proposed project's goal(s), and the nature of the costs in specific terms, i.e. materials, labor costs, etc. Specifics of how the requested County funds will be used.

The objective of the Canal Neighborhood Collaborative is to create greater awareness of and coordination among local service providers under a shared vision; that enables organizations with diverse, but complementary, resources to work together, increasing the depth and breadth of support members can provide their community, producing additional, improved results and illuminating patterns of needs and strengths within the Canal neighborhood. Marin Promise Partnership (MPP) supports a similar collaborative in West Marin. The West Marin Collaborative has convened for over 10 years and serves a vast area of rural Marin.

The work will begin with a community process that will include interviews with key multi-sector stakeholders (for example, non-profits, community-based organizations, city and county governments, schools and existing groups like the Canal Policy Working Group) and will emphasize grassroots power and voice from community stakeholders. In phase1, the Marin Promise Partnership, Backbone Team and community stakeholders will identify key leaders to create a Steering Committee(SC). This SC will outline the meeting process, structure, pacing and begin to tackle a mission and vision for the group. After the SC has put together a draft proposal for the Canal Neighborhood Collaborative, they along with the Backbone Team will identify an Advisory Group that will vet the proposal and provide feedback. This feedback will then be integrated into the proposal and shared with Canal stakeholders.

Furthermore, this work will incorporate the identification of co-facilitators from the Canal neighborhood that will receive coaching and professional development in facilitation skills and Results Based Accountability from MPP.

In phase 2 of this work Canal stakeholders and MPP will launch a community created collaborative that will meet the needs of the Canal neighborhood and further strengthen the safety net for residents.

The impact of this work will affect the interests of Canal residents, community-based organizations and government agencies (for example; grassroots community leaders, Alcohol Justice, Marin Community Clinics, Parent Services Project, Multicultural Center of Marin, Canal Alliance, Pickleweed Community Center, San Pedro Elementary School, San Rafael High School, etc.).
