

MARIN COUNTY PUBLIC FINANCING AUTHORITY

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Sections 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict-of-interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) that contains the terms of a standard conflict-of-interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This incorporation page, Regulation 18730, and the attached Appendices, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict-of-interest code of the Marin County Public Financing Authority ("Authority").

Individuals holding designated positions shall file their statements of economic interests with the Authority, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.). All statements will be retained by the Authority.

\* Consultants/New Positions shall be included in the list of designated employees and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

\*\* With respect to consultants or new positions, the Executive Director may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in scope and thus, is not required to comply with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Code Sec. 81008.)

APPENDIX B  
DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Disclosure Category 1

All sources of income, reportable interests in real property and investments and business positions in business entities located in or doing business in Marin County.
