

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Make California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) findings that the project is categorically exempt; and authorize the General Manager-Chief Engineer to accept plans and specifications and advertise for bids – Main Interceptor 2 Repairs at Novato Creek Project; Project No. 72706-2021-02.

SUMMARY AND DISCUSSION:

District staff worked with the District's consultant NUTE Engineering, Inc. to prepare plans and specifications for this project and the project is ready to advertise for bids. The project consists of rehabilitating 885 LF of 36" sewer main pipe by sliplining it with PVC pipe sections, rehabilitation of three (3) sewer manholes, including a siphon manhole upstream of the Main Interceptor sewer siphon at Novato Creek and associated tasks to perform the work including sewer bypassing, dewatering, excavation, traffic control, and surface restoration. The need for this project was identified in 2023 following inspections which revealed structural damage caused by hydrogen sulfide corrosion. The project was designated at that time as a high priority structural rehabilitation project.



The Engineer's Estimate for this work is \$745,637. Staff completed the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) documentation and determined that the project is Categorically Exempt. This determination was made because the work consists of replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity.

Staff recommend that the Board authorize the General Manager-Chief Engineer to accept plans and specifications and advertise for bids. Bids are expected to be received on or about June 18, 2025 and will be presented to the Board at a subsequent meeting. SANITARY DISTRICT
