TAY Advisory Youth Council

- Kat - I am 17 and go to Branson and am on TAY.
- Vince - I was on MCYC and was on YLI. I am 29 years old and work at the community school.
- Vince - The Growing Roots project works to figure out how to help young adults from underserved communities access culturally responsive services that support their mental health and well-being. We use non-traditional ways.
- Kat - The TAY Council is composed of 12 diverse members. We made a needs assessment and found diverse providers to address what the young adults said that they needed.
- Vince - The providers do outreach, figure out how to continue services, transportation, make sure that the services are relatable and respectful, and take on supportive roles.
- Kat - This project is time-limited due to funding. A part of the grant is to do an evaluation about the program.
- Elise - How can you see MCYC participating?
- They are working on the evaluation now but we can come and present the results to you.
- Kat - Something interesting that I learned was the 1 in 3 youth in high school were dealing with mental health issues. The accessibility of resources was shockingly poor. Not enough of these organizations are actually coming together.
