RE: Decision regarding repairs to the security cameras at Golden Gate Village

A security camera system was installed at Golden Gate Village ca. 2012. Exterior cameras were placed throughout the property. The cameras have been inoperable for some time and need repair and/or replacement. Marin Housing Authority proposes to fix the existing exterior camera system and install new cameras inside the laundry rooms within some of the residential buildings.

Because the security system was installed after the period of significance for the Golden Gate Village National Register Historic District, it is not considered a contributing feature of the in the Character-Defining Feature Study (2019) or specified as an element of the historic district in the National Register nomination form (2017). Therefore, the County determined that repairs and updates to the existing system is considered a maintenance activity and does not affect the historic property under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. This decision is dependent on the understanding that no additional features will be inserted into the historic landscape at Golden Gate Village and that any new cameras installed as part of the project will be in laundry rooms located at the interiors of the buildings. This memo provides an administrative recordation of this decision and no further environmental review is necessary.
