Summary of Decisions – Categories/Allocations

Category	Allocation	Decision
#1: Housing Needs Study	\$100,000	6/6 Vote for No Change
#2: Housing Production	90% of remaining funds	6/6 Vote to Update: Description/sub-categories updated; inclusion of Housing Predevelopment; Allocation increased from 65% to 90%
#3: Direct Housing Assistance	\$100,000	6/6 Vote to Update: Changed to fixed dollar amount; inclusion of "Emergency" under Rental Assistance
#4: Large Project Set- Aside	10% of remaining funds	6/6 Vote to Update: Allocation increased from 5% to 10%

Suggestion: Accruing Large Project Set-Aside

Current:

Guideline #3: Established funding priority percentages apply to all available Measure W Community Housing funds, including carryover balances, with the exception of the large project set aside which accrues over time.

New language proposed by County staff to address feedback from Oversight Committee:

Priority categories are allocated either a fixed dollar amount or a percentage of Measure W Community Housing funds. When annual priorities are adopted, categories with fixed dollar amounts are available for the full value allocated. The Large Project Set-Aside (LPSA) carries funds over from year to year and continues to accrue.

After accounting for fixed dollar amounts and the LPSA, the remaining Measure W Community Housing funds are allocated based on the percentages for any additional priorities. Funds not spent in a given year are reallocated using the newly approved annual allocation plan with the exception of the LPSA. These percentages should be used as a general guide in order to retain flexibility.

Suggestion: HTF Alignment and Greatest Impact/Bedrooms

Current:

Guideline #4: General alignment with the per-unit funding amounts utilized for the Affordable Housing Fund.

Guideline #5: When funding is limited, priority shall be placed on projects providing the greatest impact and greatest number of bedrooms.

Subcommittee Suggestion:

General alignment with the per-unit funding amounts utilized for the Affordable Housing Fund, with an additional \$15,000 per bedroom for affordable projects, as funds are available.





Suggestion: Distribution of Funds

Current:

Guideline #1: Measure W Community Housing fund distribution should prioritize projects that are moving forward regardless of location, with a goal of equitable distribution to high need communities across the Measure W Tax Area.

Subcommittee Suggestion:

Measure W Community Housing fund distribution should prioritize **affordable** projects that are moving forward regardless of location, with a goal of equitable distribution to high need communities across the Measure W Tax Area.
