County Responds to CCC staff LCP Amendments filing status letter

On April 22, 2016, Earth Day, the Board of Supervisors of Marin County submitted the products of more than seven years of intensive study, policy discussion, and creative community input shaped into seven Amendments to the Local Coastal Program (LCPA) to the California Coastal Commission (CCC).

The CCC staff sent a letter to the County on May 6, 2016 specifying "additional clarification, information and materials" in order to officially file the County's LCP Amendments for Commission review. The Community Development Agency has developed the additional materials requested and submitted them to CCC staff on June 3, 2016. For the convenience of readers, CDA staff has compiled the responses into a copy of the CCC letter, which can be viewed here, along with links to the cited attachments.

County staff will continue to work closely with Coastal Commission staff and members of the public leading up to a Coastal Commission hearing on the LCP later this year.
