

R2. The agency should file and keep updated its Statement of Facts with the California Secretary of State and the Marin County Clerk as required by California Code §53051.

Response

R.2 California Government Code §53050 defines “public agency” as follows:

The term “public agency,” as used in this article, means a district, public authority, public agency, and any other political subdivision or public corporation in the state, but does not include the state or a county, city and county, or city.

Cities are not required to file a Statement of Facts, therefore the City of Mill Valley will not be implementing the recommendation because it is not warranted.
