Dear Ms. Fashing,

We completed our review of the Marin County Fire Department's commercial business inspection records for from 7/1/10 through 6/30/11. This review of inspection records was undertaken by each Senior Captain at each of their respective fire stations. Our records showed no detections of illegal discharges into storm drains. We refer any stormwater violations encountered during routine inspections to the County's local stormwater coordinator, Howard Bunce. We have broken down our business inspections, as follows:

Number of businesses inspected for stormwater issues: **350**

1. Vehicle Service Facilities; **5**
2. Restaurants/Food Handling Facilities; **51**
3. Animal Care/Boarding (**excluding** Dairies, Ranches, & Farms); **3**
4. Retail Stores with dumpsters or oil changing facilities; **45**
5. Golf Courses/Nurseries; **8**
6. Construction/Contractor/Building Companies; **17**
7. Industrial (includes Marinas, Warehouses, Outdoor Manufacturing, Transportation, and Landfills); **14**
8. Other businesses with the potential to impact storm-water. **15**

The inspections covered the following areas: Point Reyes, Marin City, the San Geronimo Valley (Woodacre, San Geronimo, Forest Knolls, Lagunitas), Nicasio, Throckmorton Ridge and Tomales. If you have any questions, please contact the Fire Prevention Bureau at your earliest convenience.
