What is the Voter's Choice Act?

The Voter's Choice Act (VCA) is a law that allows counties to offer voters more choices for how, when, and where they vote. Under the VCA, all active registered voters are automatically mailed a ballot, early voting is expanded for more days, and voters may vote in-person at any regional vote center.

How Does it Work?

ALL active registered voters are automatically mailed a ballot and have THREE ways to return it:



By Mail
No Stamp Needed!



At an Official Ballot Drop Box No Stamp Needed!



At a Vote Center No Stamp Needed!

What is a Vote Center?

Voters may vote in-person at ANY vote center in Marin County. Assigned, neighborhood polling places are replaced by regional vote centers that open at least 3 days before Election Day with MORE services:



Register to Vote & Vote the Same Day



Replace a Lost or Damaged Ballot



Early Voting Vote Before Election Day!



Vote with an Accessible Voting Machine

How Do I Vote by Mail?

It's easy! Voting by mail saves time, is safe, and is free! There are many ways to return a vote by mail ballot:

- 1 VOTE your ballot; insert and seal it inside the mailing envelope that came with your ballot.
- 2 SIGN the outside of the envelope; the ballot cannot be counted without your signature!
- 3 RETURN your voted ballot by mail (to postmark on or before Election Day), OR take it to any Vote Center or Official Ballot Drop Box.

How Do I Find a Vote Center or Official Ballot Drop Box?
