This Measure was placed on the ballot by the Board of Directors of the Bel Marin Keys Public Utility District.

If this Measure is approved by two-thirds of the votes cast on this special tax proposal, the Bel Marin Keys Public Utility District will levy a parcel tax beginning July 1, 2024, and expiring June 30, 2045. If approved, beginning on July 1, 2024, the rate of the special tax shall be \$1,800 per parcel. Each fiscal year thereafter, the maximum annual rate shall increase by 2.5% per year. The Bel Marin Keys Public Utility District estimates revenue from this Measure will be approximately \$1,263,600 annually, plus the annual rate increase of 2.5% per year. Property otherwise exempt from property taxes are exempt from this special tax.

The stated purposes for the funds raised by this special tax are for infrastructure maintenance and/or replacement for gates, levees, lagoons, moats, open space, parks, flood control, and the community center within the District. Funds may also be used for dredging creeks, lagoons, and waterways. Additionally, funds may be expended for designing, engineering, and constructing new flood control improvements, including pumps, marsh and wetland restoration, and other responses to sea level rise and climate change. Funds may also be used to apply for grants and for administration of the special tax.

ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE G

Your "YES" vote for a parcel tax will make funding available annually for protecting our community from sea level rise, flooding, and enhance infrastructure serving all properties in the district. The funding will be used to finance the costs of repair, replacement, renovation, maintenance, improvement acquisition and construction of existing and new infrastructure serving property in the district, including but not limited to our locks, levees, dredging the creek and lagoons and improve our open spaces to better serve our entire community.

Funding will also be used to participate in and benefit from partnership grants with government and agencies to provide improvements to the creek and watershed to reduce flood risks and maintain our property values. All money collected will be spent only for the benefit of our community. The money collected will be kept in restricted accounts to be used for infrastructural improvements and projects.

A professional engineering management company working with a citizen advisory oversight committee composed of up to twelve residents representing all parts of our community to advise the community service District Board of Directors regarding where and when projects should be funded and will meet as needed but no less than twice annually. An annual audit will also be provided listing all expenditures. Approval of this measure is the most cost-effective way to provide necessary funding for the next 20 years to keep Bel Marin Keys thriving.

Your "YES" vote will authorize an annual tax of \$1,800 (\$150 a month) per accessor parcel within the district. It will appear in your regular county tax bill. Without your "YES" vote our waterways, property and waterfront lifestyle will deteriorate.

FULL TEXT OF MEASURE G

BEL MARIN KEYS COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT

INTRODUCTION

The Board of Directors of the Bel Marin Keys Community Services District is placing a special tax measure on the ballot for the purpose of protecting District property against sea level rise and climate change and enhancing the infrastructure that serves properties in the District, and establishing a funding source that cannot be taken by the State of California.

SPECIAL PARCEL TAX AUTHORIZATION

Upon approval of this proposition by at least two-thirds of the registered voters voting on the proposition, the Bel Marin Community Services District will be authorized to levy a special tax at the maximum annual rate of \$1,800 (\$150 per month) in fiscal year 2024-25 upon each taxable parcel in the District, generating \$1,263,600 of revenue in tax year 2024-25, which maximum annual rate shall increase thereafter at the rate of 2.5% per year.

If approved, the special tax will be levied beginning in the fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2024, and ending in the fiscal year that begins on July 1, 2044, and will be subject to all the accountability requirements specified below.

EXEMPTIONS FROM PARCEL TAX

All property that would otherwise be exempt from property taxes will also be exempt from the Special Tax.

ACCOUNTABILITY REQUIREMENTS

The provisions in this section are specifically included in this proposition in order that the voters and taxpayers in the District may be assured that their money will be spent wisely and in order to comply with California Government Code Section 50075.1 and 50075.3. As required by the laws of the State of California, the proceeds of the Special Tax will be deposited into a special account established by the District and will be applied only to the specific purposes identified below.

The Board of Directors of the District has directed the chief fiscal officer of the District, which is initially the District Manager, to file a report with the Board of Directors no later than January 1 of each year containing (a) the amount of special tax funds collected and expended and (b) the status of any project required or authorized to be funded.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSES

The statement shown below is a part of the ballot proposition and must be reproduced in any official document required to contain the full statement of the proposition.

The purpose of the ballot measure is to protect District property against sea level rise and climate change and enhance the infrastructure serving properties in the District, and to establish a funding source that cannot be taken by the State of California. The proceeds of the special tax will be used to finance costs the costs of (a) repair, replacement, renovation, maintenance, improvement, acquisition and construction of existing and new infrastructure serving property in the District, including but not limited to locks and levees and (b) dredging of creeks, lagoons and waterways.

More specifically, the special tax will finance the following: MGBMK-2

1. The costs of maintaining, improving, repairing and replacing existing infrastructure, including, but not limited to:

Locks and gates

Levees

Lagoons

Moats

Community open spaces and parks

Flood control piping and overflows

Community center

- 2. The costs of dredging creeks, lagoons and waterways
- 3. The costs of acquiring and constructing new infrastructure, including, but not limited to:

New flood control improvements, including but not limited to pumps and marsh restoration

- Improvements to respond to sea level rise and climate change, including wetlands restoration and preservation
- 4. All capital costs of the infrastructure described above, including, but limited to, the costs of design, engineering and construction management
- 5. The costs of applying for grants from private and federal, state and local government sources
- 6. The costs of District administration of the special tax.

WHERE'S MY BALLOT?



VOTE SAFE.

Get a notice when your vote-by-mail ballot is mailed, received, and counted! Sign up at **WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov** to get an automatic email, text, or call about the status of your ballot.

VOTE SECURE.

Every signature on a vote-by-mail envelope is compared to the voter's information on file. If the signature doesn't compare, the voter will get a letter with information about how to correct it. After ballots are accepted for counting, they are removed from their envelopes in a way that protects voter privacy. Once removed, ballots are counted by scanning equipment then sealed in containers that may be opened only for an audit after the election. Voter privacy and votes are protected during the entire process.

VOTE BY MAIL!

Postage is pre-paid! Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before March 5 and received by the Elections Department by March 12.

You do not have to vote on every contest. If you make a mistake, call the Elections Department and ask for a replacement.

YOU HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS



- 1. **The right to vote if you are a registered voter.** You are eligible to vote if you are:
 - ★ a U.S. citizen living in California
 - * at least 18 years old
 - registered where you currently live
- ★ Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony, and
- not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court
- 2. The right to vote if you are a registered voter even if your name is not on the list.

You will vote using a provisional ballot. Your vote will be counted if elections officials determine that you are eligible to vote.

- 3. The right to vote if you are still in line when the polls close.
- 4. **The right to cast a secret ballot** without anyone bothering you or telling you how to vote.
- 5. **The right to get a new ballot if you have made a mistake,** if you have not already cast your ballot. You can:

Ask an elections official at a polling place for a new ballot, Exchange your vote-by-mail ballot for a new one at an elections office, or at your polling place, or

Vote using a provisional ballot.

- 6. **The right to get help casting your ballot** from anyone you choose, except from your employer or union representative.
- 7. The right to drop off your completed vote-by-mail ballot at any polling place in California.
- 8. **The right to get election materials in a language other than English** if enough people in your voting precinct speak that language.
- 9. The right to ask questions to elections officials about election procedures and watch the election process. If the person you ask cannot answer your questions, they must send you to the right person for an answer. If you are disruptive, they can stop answering you.
- 10. **The right to report any illegal or fraudulent election activity** to an elections official or the Secretary of State's office.

SPECIAL NOTICE

- Polls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on the day indicated in the posted county Voter Information Guide.
- Specific instructions on how to vote, including how to cast a provisional ballot, can be obtained from a poll worker or by reading the information mailed to you by your local elections official.
- If you are a newly registered voter, you may be asked to provide appropriate identification or other documentation according to federal law. But please note that every individual has the right to cast a provisional ballot even if he or she does not provide the documentation.
- It is against the law to represent yourself as being eligible to vote unless you meet all of the requirements to vote under federal and state law.
- It is against the law to tamper with voting equipment.


