

**NOTICE OF ARGUMENT DEADLINES FOR COUNTY, SCHOOL AND DISTRICT
MEASURES TO BE VOTED ON IN MARIN COUNTY
AT THE NOVEMBER 6, 2012 PRESIDENTIAL GENERAL ELECTION**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Marin County Registrar of Voters that the **Presidential General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 6, 2012**; that the polls will be open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. on the day thereof; and

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the following County, School and District measures will be placed upon the ballot at said election and read as follows:

MEASURES SUBMITTED TO VOTERS

COUNTY OF MARIN MEASURE A

To preserve quality of life and maintain open space, parks, and farmland, with funds that cannot be taken by the State, shall Marin County: Protect streams, baylands, natural areas, and wildlife habitat; Manage vegetation to preserve biodiversity and reduce wildfire risk; Repair and replace deteriorating park facilities; and Maintain and enhance walking, hiking, biking and equestrian trails; by enacting a one-quarter cent sales tax, with a citizens' oversight committee, annual audits, with all funds spent only in Marin County?

MILL VALLEY SCHOOL DISTRICT MEASURE B

To replace significant cuts by the State in education funding; protect the quality of local elementary and middle schools and attract and keep highly qualified core academic teachers; shall the Mill Valley School District be authorized to implement a parcel tax of one hundred ninety-six dollars for eight years, requiring annual audit and accountability measures, and with all revenues kept local and used exclusively for Mill Valley elementary and middle schools?

SHORELINE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT MEASURE C

Qualified Special Tax Assessment for Educational Programs: To maintain existing school programs and improve the quality of education; to provide funds to buy updated textbooks and materials for math, reading, and writing courses; and to enhance critical programs including, but not limited to, computer science, library, and arts programs, shall the Shoreline Unified School District extend the existing \$184.70 a year parcel tax, increasing annually at 2%, for no more than eight years?

MESA PARK FIREHOUSE COMMUNITY PARK AGENCY MEASURE E

Shall Resolution No. 9 of the Board of Commissioners of Mesa Park be confirmed, establishing a special tax of \$49 per year per improved parcel, commencing with fiscal year 2013-2014 and continuing for a period of 4 years, for the maintenance and operation of Mesa Park located at 110 Mesa Road, and shall the appropriations limits be confirmed in the amount equal to the tax revenues received by this parcel tax?

STINSON BEACH FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT MEASURE F

Shall the appropriations limit established for Stinson Beach Fire Protection District pursuant to Article XIII B of the California Constitution be adjusted to include the combined total of all revenue sources for the fiscal years 2011-2012 through 2012-2017 in order to continue funding for the fire protection and ambulance services provided by the District?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that arguments for or against the above measures shall not exceed 300 words in length. The Registrar of Voters of Marin County shall print an argument for and argument against said measures in the sample ballot mailed to each voter in the above districts.

Arguments for or against said measures, with signed verification form, should be submitted to the Registrar of Voters' Office, Room 121, Marin Civic Center, San Rafael, California, **not later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, August 20, 2012**. The governing board, or any member or members of the board, or any bona fide association of citizens, or any individual voter who is eligible to vote on the measure or any combination of such associations and voters may submit written arguments for or against a measure.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that direct arguments for or against said measures may not be changed or withdrawn after 4:30 p.m. on August 20, 2012.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that when the Registrar of Voters has selected the arguments for and against said measures, copies of the argument in favor of said measures shall be sent to the authors of the argument against and copies of the argument against shall be sent to the authors of the argument in favor.

The authors may prepare and submit rebuttal arguments not exceeding 250 words. The rebuttal arguments must be filed with the Registrar of Voters by **4:30 p.m. on Monday, August 27, 2012**

Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the direct arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the direct argument, which it seeks to rebut.

A verification form available from the Registrar of Voters' Office must accompany all arguments and rebuttal arguments. Forms are available at www.marinvotes.org. For further information, contact the Registrar of Voters' Office at (415) 473-6437.

All materials pertaining to the measures will be available for public examination in the office of the Registrar of Voters for ten (10) days from the date of filing.

NOTE: Arguments for or against measure on the ballot for the Town of Ross should be filed with the respective city or town clerk. Check with the city or town clerk for the deadlines to receive arguments and rebuttals.
