**SUBJECT:** Ordinance Establishing Exemptions to the Bicycle Prohibitions on Sidewalks

**RECOMMENDATION:** 1) Conduct merit hearing; 2) adopt ordinance, and; 3) adopt resolution.

**SUMMARY:** Current Marin County Code prohibits bicycles on sidewalks within a business district and prohibits bicycle riders 14 years or older on sidewalks within a residential district. The proposed change would allow the Board to specify sidewalks that are exempt from these bicycle sidewalk riding prohibitions. The initial request to examine this Ordinance was made by the City of Sausalito. Specifically, an exemption for the sidewalk on Donahue Street from the southern intersection with Drake Avenue to the Sausalito city limits is merited at this time. In this area, Donahue Street has a sidewalk that is more than eight feet wide and is often used by Marin City bicyclists to access the Mill Valley-Sausalito bike path. Although bicyclists over 14 can ride in the travel way on Donahue Street, the narrow travel way and proximity of the US 101 overpass abutments make bicycling in the travel way a challenge on this high volume arterial. The proposed exemption will provide bicyclists a safer alternative.

The Marin City Community Services District reviewed the proposed exemption at their May 5, 2016 Board meeting and voted unanimously to support the proposed exemption. The City of Sausalito and Marin County's Bicycle Advisory Group also support the proposed bicycle sidewalk prohibition exemption. The County Sheriff and California Highway Patrol (CHP) both support the proposal ordinance, but requested that a speed limit be established on sidewalks that are exempt. A 15 mph speed limit (unless otherwise posted) for sidewalks that are specified exempt is included in the ordinance.

A first reading of the ordinance was conducted by your Board on June 7, 2016. Also recommended is a resolution specifying that the sidewalk on Donahue Street from the southern intersection with Drake Avenue to the city limits with Sausalito is exempt, including the section along Bridge Blvd.


