SUBJECT: Ordinance Establishing Speed Limits on Portions of Horseshoe Hill Road, Bolinas

SUMMARY: In response to residents' concerns regarding speeding, Public Works staff conducted speed surveys and reviewed the speed limits on Horseshoe Hill Road. This is a two-lane, undivided highway between CA SR-1 Shoreline Hwy and Olema Bolinas Road; a distance of approximately 1.6 miles. Although Horseshoe Hill Road is currently posted 30 mph, this speed limit has not previously been certified for radar enforcement.

Capital Projects

Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA)

The California Vehicle Code (CVC) establishes procedures to set radar-enforceable speed limits. In these cases, the local jurisdiction must set a speed limit based upon the prevailing speed (85% of drivers surveyed). We have conducted an Engineering and Traffic Survey (E&TS) pursuant to CVC Section 627 and recommend that the following radar enforceable speed limits on Horseshoe Hill Road be established as shown in the following table:
