

RUSH CREEK OPEN SPACE PRESERVE



BAHIA FIRE ROAD & TRAIL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT





Project Summary: The Marin County Open Space District (MCOSD) is proposing a project that would upgrade a hiking trail, realign a trail for multiuse, convert a trail segment from road to trail, improve equestrian trail access, and decommission a steep segment of trail to restore habitat. This proposed project was identified in 2017 during the collaborative Region 4 designation process as part of the MCOSD Road and Trail Management Plan.

Features would include:

- Upgrade an existing social trail to sustainable standards and designate it as hiking only
- Realign Blue Oak Trail for multiuse
- Decommission the steep road segment of Iron Gate Fire Road and restore habitat
- Convert the sustainable segment of Iron Gate Fire Road from road to trail
- Designate new trail for equestrians and hikers

Environmental Document: The MCOSD has prepared an Initial Study/Proposed Mitigated Declaration to comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The 30-day public review and comment period is **April 19 at 8:30 am – May 21, 2021 at 5:00pm**.
