ORDINANCE NO. _____ ORDINANCE OF THE MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPTING NEW DEVICE REGISTRATION FEES REFERENCED IN CHAPTER 5.44 OF THE MARIN COUNTY CODE TO BE IMPLEMENTED IN STAGES FROM 2006 THROUGH 2008

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF MARIN HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, recent legislation authorizes the recovery of higher device registration fees not to exceed actual costs of performing the inspection, testing and registration services; and

WHEREAS, said increase in device registration fees will defray the costs of the program administered by the County of Marin; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors supports the recovery of the costs incurred by this important program to insure the accurate measurement of items in commerce and advance consumer protection;

NOW THEREFORE, the following maximum fees set forth under the year 2008 are hereby adopted but implemented in the stages set forth below:

SECTION I.

Device Registration fees pursuant to Chapter 5.44 of the Marin County Code are increased to the maximum figures shown for the year 2008, but shall be introduced in stages upon the first of January of each identified year as set forth in tables A and B below:

[Footnotes]

(4) A co-located business is one that: (a) operates in, at or immediately adjacent to another business that pays an annual registration fee under this ordinance; (b) at that location has the same street address as the other business; (c) is at that location with the written permission of the other business; and (d) uses weighing devices with 30 or fewer pounds capacity or measuring devices that dispense only 5 or fewer gallons. One example is water-dispensing machines outside a grocery store.

SECTION II. This ordinance shall be liberally construed to achieve its purposes and preserve its validity. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and every section,

subsection, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION III. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be in full force and effect as of thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage and shall be published once before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage, with the names of the supervisors voting for and against the same in the MARIN INDEPENDENT JOURNAL, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Marin.
