

**PROCLAIMING  
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE  
SEPTEMBER 21, 2006**

**WHEREAS**, the issue of peace embraces the deepest hopes of all peoples and remains humanity's guiding inspiration; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1981 the United Nations proclaimed the International Day of Peace be "*devoted to commemorating and strengthening the ideals of peace both within and among all nations and peoples*"; and

**WHEREAS**, the United Nations expanded the observance of the International Day of Peace in 2001 to include the call for a day of global ceasefire and non-violence, and invited all nations and people to honor a cessation of hostilities for the duration of the day; and

**WHEREAS**, there is growing support within our community for the observance of the International Day of Peace, which affirms a vision of our world at peace, and fosters cooperation between individuals, organizations and nations; and

**WHEREAS**, global crises impel all residents to work toward converting humanity's noblest aspirations for world peace into a practical reality for future generations.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marin hereby proclaims September 21, 2006, as an "International Day of Peace"
