REGULAR MEETING OF THE MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HELD TUESDAY, JULY 10, 2007, AT 10:06 A.M.

The Board met as the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors at 9:08 a.m. and convened as the Board of Supervisors at 10:06 a.m.

10. SUPERVISOR ARNOLD REQUESTING LETTER SUPPORTING THE CITY OF NOVATO'S REQUEST FOR THE SONOMA-MARIN AREA RAIL TRANSIT ("SMART") DISTRICT TO FULLY ANALYZE THE CUMULATIVE IMPACTS OF THE NORTH COAST RAILROAD AUTHORITY'S ("NCRA") PLANS FOR INCREASED FREIGHT OPERATION

Supervisor Arnold gave a brief update on the North Coast Railroad Authority's ("NCRA") plans for increased freight operations through Novato. Supervisor Arnold asked for the Board's support to send a letter to the Sonoma Marin Area Rail Transit ("SMART") to thoroughly and carefully analyze the cumulative impacts of the NCRA's plans for increased freight operations.

Novato Councilwoman Carole Dillon-Knutson; representatives of the Sierra Club Marin, the Marin Conservation League, Sustainable Novato, and Marin Audubon Society; and several members of the community expressed concern regarding the proposed number of NCRA freight trains which would run through Novato, requested a separate Environmental Impact Report ("EIR"), noted impacts to SMART trains sharing the tracks, and expressed support for the letter.

A few members of the public requested a stronger letter and expressed concern regarding proposed NCRA plans to extend the freight trains farther north to Eureka.

Supervisor McGlashan noted that he is the Vice-Chair of the SMART Agency and advised that the SMART Board has already committed to produce an updated and thorough EIR analysis. Supervisor McGlashan commented on the speculative plans of the NCRA and noted that the NCRA Board is obligated to produce its own EIR.

Supervisor McGlashan briefly commented on several issues regarding SMART's study of the NCRA's EIR. Supervisor McGlashan suggested that the public contact the SMART Operations Committee for updates of discussions regarding interactions between freight operations and SMART operations. Supervisor McGlashan also advised that SMART owns the tracks and, if a SMART commute rail initiative passes, would have the final say of who uses the tracks and how often.

Supervisor Adams expressed concern regarding the NCRA plan and suggested that a thorough study be conducted on the level of freight on Marin railways.

Supervisor Arnold thanked her colleagues for their support.

Supervisor McGlashan announced that the Novato City Council will hold a public forum on "Resumption of Freight Train Service" on July 19, 2007, and that County officials will hold a "scoping session" with rail officials to address noise, speed, and other issues on July 31, 2007.

The Board recessed at 12:04 p.m. to meet as the Marin County Open Space District Board of Directors and the Marin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors and reconvened as the Board of Supervisors at 1:46 p.m.

The Board recessed at 1:47 p.m. to meet in closed session in Room 324 A.

15. CLOSED SESSION

The Board met in closed session at 1:50 p.m. to discuss the following:

a. Conference with legal counsel regarding existing litigation pursuant to California Government Code Section 54956.9(a). Name of case: Neely v. Marinwood Community Services. Marin County Superior Court, Case No. CV 064793.

The Board reconvened in open session at 2:24 p.m. Supervisor Kinsey was absent.

The President Pro-Tem reported that the Board met in closed session and advised that there was no announcement at this time.

16. HEARING: CRANE APPEAL OF THE KAPLAN DESIGN REVIEW APPLICATION. (APN 074-262-32)

By letter dated July 10, 2007, Community Development Agency Director Alex Hinds and Senior Planner Christine Gimmler submitted their report and recommendations regarding the above-captioned matter.

Ms. Gimmler gave a brief presentation regarding the background and basis of appeal for this project. Ms. Gimmler noted that during the Planning Commission's hearing, the Planning Commissioners approved a proposal by the applicant to lower a stairwell tower on the front of the building's elevation, as well as requesting additional landscaping. Ms. Gimmler advised that the project was also reviewed and approved by the Kent Woodlands Property Owners Association. Ms. Gimmler advised that staff is recommending that the Board adopt a resolution denying the Crane appeal and sustaining the Planning Commission's conditional approval of the Kaplan Design Review.

In response to a question from Supervisor McGlashan, Mr. Hinds advised that the project incorporates energy efficient features consistent with the size and scale of the proposed development.

The hearing was declared open to receive public comment.

Jerry Polsky, project Architect, spoke briefly on behalf of the applicants about the proposed home's design, noting that it was subjected to a thorough review by the Homeowner's Association Architectural Review Committee and Community Development Agency staff, who stated that the proposed project would not adversely impact the views and privacy of the adjoining neighbors. Mr. Polsky submitted letters of support from a number of neighbors, as well as photo montages of the proposed project.

Bob Smith, Chairman of the Kent Woodlands Property Owners Association Architectural Committee, noted that the Committee made numerous site visits and held numerous preliminary review meetings regarding the proposed project. Mr. Smith noted that the architect and applicant responded in a positive manner to the Committee's directions to improve the originally submitted design. Mr. Smith stated that it is the opinion of the Architectural Committee, subsequently supported by the Appeals Committee of the Board of Directors, that there are no significant impacts to privacy, views, or the general characteristics of the immediate neighborhood.

Basia Crane, appellant, and Peter Crane, son of the appellant, expressed concerns regarding loss of privacy and views due to the proposed project. The Cranes noted that the proposed landscaping would block sunlight and sense of airiness between existing trees and commented on the proposed development's impact on the character of the local community.

Several neighbors and members of the public spoke to oppose the proposed project, expressing concerns regarding the size of the home, loss of views, loss of sunlight, and impact on the character of the local community. Two neighbors submitted photographs of the proposed development.

Richard Perlstein, project Architect, noted that the story poles shown in one of the staff photos were very visible because the photo was taken shortly after several trees were pruned for the winter. Mr. Perlstein advised that the applicant has proposed additional landscaping which will provide year-round screening.

Michael Yandle, project Landscape Architect, and the Project Arborist spoke about the existing landscape buffer that runs around the entire project site. Mr. Yandle commented further that a significant amount of additional landscaping is proposed to fill any existing gaps in the screening.

Lorin Kaplan, applicant, spoke about the time and money spent on architectural meetings and neighborhood site visits. Mr. Kaplan advised that every effort has been made to address the concerns of the neighborhood and commented on the letters of support received from several neighbors. Mr. Kaplan urged the Board to deny the Crane appeal and support the Planning Commission's approval of their Design Review application.

A neighbor spoke in support of the proposed project.

Seeing no one else present to speak, the public hearing was closed.

Supervisor Brown advised that he will stay personally involved and will work with staff and neighbors to minimize any adverse impacts of the project. Supervisor Brown also requested that staff add language to the conditions of approval regarding a maintenance agreement in the form of a bond or letter of credit to insure that the landscaping is maintained.

M/s Supervisor Brown - Supervisor Arnold to: (a) sustain the Planning Commission's conditional approval; and (b) adopt revised Resolution No. 2007-98 denying the Crane appeal and approving the Kaplan Design Review.
