## RESOLUTION NO. 2010-\_\_\_\_ RESOLUTION OF THE MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OPPOSING PROPOSITION 23 REGARDING SUSPENSION OF AB32

**WHEREAS**, the "California Jobs Initiative" has qualified for the November 2, 2010 General Election and will be on the statewide ballot as Proposition 23; and

**WHEREAS**, Proposition 23 will suspend California's landmark clean energy and air pollution control standards that were created by AB 32; and

**WHEREAS**, supporters of Proposition 23 claim it will only suspend AB 32's air pollution and health regulations until California's economy improves, but in reality the measure will ensure that California's clean air standards cannot take effect until the state's unemployment rate drops to a fixed level that has rarely been achieved; and

**WHEREAS**, this initiative will result in increased levels of air pollution and public health risks; and

**WHEREAS**, if approved, this measure would have a detrimental impact upon California's newly emerging clean energy businesses that have flourished because of California clean energy and clean air laws, resulting in the loss of jobs and economic growth; and

**WHEREAS**, by harming competition from clean energy producers and producing an uncertain business environment, Proposition 23 would further perpetuate the state's dependency on fossil fuels, which will result in rising prices for consumers and a continued drag on our economy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the County of Marin expresses its opposition to Proposition 23 regarding suspension of AB 32 on the November 2, 2010, statewide general election ballot.
