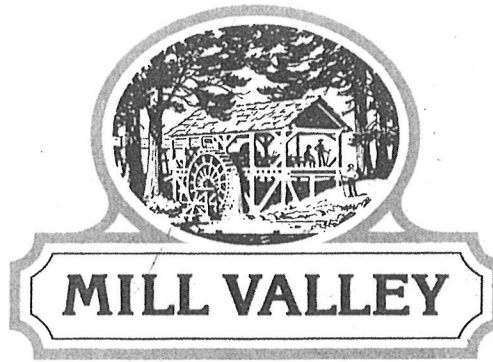

This letter will serve as my response from the City of Mill Valley.


RECOMMENDATIONS:

Recommendation 2: The Grand Jury recommends that the Police Departments of San Rafael, Sausalito, Ross, Fairfax, Central Marin and Mill Valley request that their respective city councils provide funds to obtain on-officer cameras and pursue other funding sources as well.

- Recommendation numbered: R2 Funds have been allocated and equipment has been purchased.

The Mill Valley City Council has allocated funding to purchase eight VIEVU body-worn cameras for patrol officers to wear while on duty. The cameras are in the final phase of programming and are scheduled for field deployment within the next week. The VIEVU camera system readily integrates with the existing in car camera system used by the Mill Valley Police Department since 1996.
